## Campus Crime Alert 2014-10-31

### WHAT IS THIS NOTICE?

Campus Crime Alerts are released by the University of Oregon Police Department when certain crimes are reported on or near campus property, and in compliance with federal law. These timely warnings provide information about campus safety situations, and allow campus community members to take precautions for personal safety. All crimes should be reported as soon as possible to local law enforcement.

*Please note this message may contain information that some may find upsetting.*

*This incident occurred off-campus and away from UO property, but is nearby, involves a student, and is in an area frequented by students.*

### UPDATE FROM EUGENE POLICE:

Since the first report, police have received two additional reports from the same general area of Kinsrow, around the same time: 3:30 a.m. In one report, the female awoke to see the suspect standing in her bedroom. She challenged him and he left. She said nothing was taken. The second report was from a male who said the suspect was in the apartment around the same time frame (3:30 a.m.) and the suspect left when challenged.

### FIRST NOTICE:

The Eugene Police Department has released information about an incident reported earlier this morning (October 31, 2014) at a residence in the Duck's Village area of Kinsrow Avenue. The resident, a UO student, reported that just before 6:00 a.m., she woke to find an unknown man in her room, and that he tried to get in bed with her and touched her. She said she screamed and the man fled.

She told police that the man took some cash. She described him as black, age 20-25, about 6-feet tall with a medium build, and wearing a black sweatshirt. No further suspect information was provided. Eugene Police searched the area but didn't locate the suspect.

### SAFETY TIPS FROM UOPD

- No action or inaction by a crime survivor makes that person responsible for his or her victimization. Perpetrators are responsible for crimes and their effects. The following suggestions may help reduce the possibility of experiencing such a crime, or may improve opportunities to receive prompt assistance.
- It is a crime to intentionally touch someone against his or her will, regardless of the situation.
- It is a crime to enter someone's residence without permission, regardless of whether the door is locked.

- Communities are safest when members look out for each other: report any suspicious activity or unauthorized strangers immediately.
- In residence halls or secured apartment complexes, do not let in strangers, do not allow strangers to enter behind you as a courtesy, and do not lend out keys.
- In residence halls or secured apartment complexes, do not let in strangers, do not allow strangers to enter behind you as a courtesy, and do not lend out keys. Only open the front door of a residence to someone you know or trust.
- Immediately report any malfunctioning doors or windows in your residence to the property managers or residence hall staff, and insist the problem be corrected as soon as possible.
- Report criminal activity (such as a break-in or intruder, robbery, or assault) immediately to 9-1-1, or for non-emergencies on campus, to UOPD at 541-346-2919.
